ART, MUSIC & SHOPPING




THE GREAT OUTDOORS

GULLAH HISTORY TOUR

You may be familiar with the term Gullah as a language, warmly spoken but rarely written, passed along descendants of the earliest African Americans to inhabit the Lowcountry. But explore Gullah as a broader culture – one that continues to thrive in Charleston - and discover how a dark history gave way to a beloved legacy. A visit to the Old Slave Mart is emotionally stirring, and is followed by a guided tour of significant spaces and events marking the centuries-long journey of the Gullah community. Taste tender and flavorful Gullah cuisine, watch the authentic Gullah artisans weave sweetgrass baskets in the Charleston City Market and, of course, hear the endearing creole-esque tongue native to the "Gullah Nation."

This experience can be customized with a visit to the International African American Museum. At the site of America's most prolific slave port, the IAAM honors the many thousands of Africans forced into slavery. Enter into the untold stories of the African American journey at this brilliant and sacred site through remarkable artifacts and exhibitions.

PLANTATION TOURS

If your minds-eye image of Southern plantation culture has been formed by the silver screen alone, brace yourself for a remarkable awakening. A plantation has the greater purpose to enlighten our understanding of the experience of slavery in our country. Plantations are the museums for an educational reckoning with this tragic aspect of America's past. From Boone Hall's dramatic "Avenue of Oaks," to the rice ponds of Magnolia Plantation, to the gardens of Middleton Place, to the architectural wonders of Drayton Hall... your view of the beauty, history, tradition, and most importantly the people, of these sprawling places will be forever changed.



HOLY CITY TOUR

Not everyone agrees about the origins of Charleston's friendly moniker, the Holy City, but no one disputes its fit. The outlines of historic church steeples are perhaps the most recognizable shapes in Charleston's skyline, and those structures gave the young city a reputation for religious tolerance and inclusion centuries ago. Today, the peninsula contains one of the densest and most diverse concentration of places of worship in the nation. To host guests on a walk in and around six of the most prominent churches in Charleston – including some where tours are typically prohibited – is an honor. Admire the breathtaking architecture and marvel at sanctuary acoustics, then stroll the courtyards and cemeteries while you hear moving tales of the past. As you pause before the entrance at Emanuel AME Church, please gather in a moment of reflection and place the flowers we provide you as a gesture of reverence and peace.





LEE BROTHERS IN THE GARDEN

Charleston natives Matt and Ted Lee unwittingly launched themselves into the world of travel and food journalism as college students. Simply aiming to fulfill a Southern void for Northeast co-eds, they became purveyors of mail-order boiled peanuts. Serendipity and publishers came calling, and the rest is delicious history; the brothers now host their own cable TV show, have penned multiple cookbooks, and are regular

contributors to national print and screen. One thing hasn't changed, however, and that is their deep love for Charleston. Join them in the garden of one of several historic homes such as the Governor Thomas Bennett House. This home and its outdoor sanctuary is one of the largest in the city, providing a dreamy backdrop for a culinary-kissed outing with the Lee brothers.



A TASTE OF CHARLESTON

In a private space, guests will experience a taste of the various dishes and signature drinks that epitomize the bounty of the Lowcountry. ART TOUR

CHARLESTON ARCHITECTURAL TOUR



OLD VILLAGE BIKE TOUR

The first European settlement east of the Cooper River, Mount Pleasant dates back over 300 years. The area considered to be the town's "Old Village" is where the earliest settlers landed, and today is home to a quaint little commercial district, historical churches, a huge children's park, and some of the Lowcountry's oldest and best-preserved residences. The neighboring corridor of Shem Creek is a lively waterway, park, and commercial hub. Fantastic eateries line the creek, where diners can nibble the freshest seafood while watching boats – and dolphins – glide by. On a guided bike tour through this charming area, guests are treated to a courtyard wine-tasting and a gallery crawl through the Charleston Artist Collective... and a peek at all the fabulous influences Charleston gave her friend across the harbor.

WEST SIDE BIKE TOUR

Hop on a bike from a local cycle-slinger, and follow your guide along Charleston's Westside. Wind through the campus of The Military College of South Carolina, The Citadel, as cadets march by and scenes from Pat Conroy's Citadel- set novels become remarkably vivid. Cruise around the vast Hampton Park before refueling with a "forage board" at the cozy (and Bill Murray coowned!) Harold's Cabin or a fried oyster sandwich at Leon's. You never knew how much you could love a part of Charleston you've likely never heard of.

CLUBHOUSE CHALLENGE™

When we stop and think about the legacy we are leaving for our children, for our local community and beyond, one thing is sure, inaction will not yield change. Confronted with the magnitude of needs worldwide and locally, the ability to set in motion a plan of action can feel either impossible or not enough and we can all get discouraged. How can we unleash the limits we sometimes too quickly put on our own potential for making a difference?

A Clubhouse Challenge™ does just that, helping people step out and do something, to create a culture of generosity. The KLH Group gives groups and/or corporations the opportunity to give back to the local community via unique service projects. The Clubhouse Challenge™ is our first service project, it involves pallets of construction materials, teams of 8-10 volunteers and the story and presence of a child with cancer. Working side by side, the "star" of the day and his/her team build a clubhouse, complete with flower boxes, name plate and color scheme. As we enter into the life of a deserving child, we have the privilege of getting to know them personally and we give them this brand new clubhouse a space all their own, which opens up a world where imagination takes over and the worries and woes of the world are left behind. Each participant walks away a changed person, and one degree closer to becoming their very own difference maker. The impact the Clubhouse Challenge™ has on the individual lives of these children and all who participate is invaluable. We invite you to be a part of this mission with us, think of all the doors we could open together.





FEED THE NEED EVENT

They may look like simple bags of rice and soy, but these meals represent the hopes and dreams of people worldwide. Our volunteers are the heart of the mission to end hunger and we could not send millions of meals around the globe each year without you.


Since inception, our partner has packaged over 540 million meals, and each year they engage hundreds of thousands of volunteers globally, relying on groups like yours to package the meals — this is where you come into play.

We are proposing an afternoon of FUN while packing meals. A DJ will set the tone of the event playing the latest and greatest while groups enter into the venue adorned in red caps! We will have runners, packers, fillers and boxers all assigned and the flow of this give back project will be seamless.

Your group will assemble meals for people all around in the globe in need. The assembly process combines rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a flavoring mix including 23 essential vitamins and minerals into small meal packages. These meal packages are shipped around the world to support school feeding programs and crisis relief. The food stores easily, transports quickly and has a shelf-life of two years. Through partnering with KLH Group, you also partner with RISE, an international hunger relief organization that distributes food and life-changing aid to the world's most vulnerable, mobilizing the necessary resources to end hunger by 2030.









TRANSITIONAL HOUSING BOXES

In 1984, community leaders came together to start a shelter (One80Place) to help the growing number of people who were homeless. 40 years later, what started as a small effort to address an emergency need grew to be largest provider of homelessness services in Charleston. While they are bigger than they used to be, they are local, regionally focused, and cater to their clients one person at a time, one family at a time. One way we can serve the residents of One80Place is by creating transitional housing kits!

This on-property experience will begin with a speaking panel of ONE80 Place leadership and board members. The panel will speak to the impact ONE80 Place has

made in the Charleston community, and how clients are supported both short-term and long-term for optimal success. Panel will highlight the on-site clinic and how basic medical care has become part of the services offered within the shelter.

Guests will learn about the Transitional Housing Boxes that are provided to ONE80 Place clients when moving into their own housing. These kits include essential home goods such as cleaning supplies, a set of bedding, and basic kitchen tools. While individually low cost, stocking a new home can become a financial hurdle for many. Strategic support such as these boxes are a tool ONE80 Place uses to support clients as they make the transition into their own housing, and new life.



RETURN TO THE TABLE

Return to the Table engages groups in meeting a real need: to provide furniture as a basic necessity of life! The table is a basic element that we often take for granted. It was brought to our attention that this simple furnishing is often missing! Local nonprofits have saved over 9,000 Charlestonians from homelessness in the 35 years they've been serving the City's underserved. But when its clients move into their new homes, they are often without the most basic pieces of furniture. As much as they would love to "return to the table," they find themselves without a table to which they can return.

To help, local Homeless Shelters provide each family with "move in" kits to make the

adjustment to living in a home more sustainable. Ideally, a cleaning kit, kitchen kit, linen kit and furniture kit are provided. People are set up for success. As they begin settling in, we believe the gift of a dining table would also be essential to the quality of life.

Over the course of two hours, your group will divide into teams, each constructing a small dining table and pair of chairs. When the sawdust settles, there will be tables and chairs ready for delivery, to be set for meals and gathered around for connection. Time and again, we are reminded that there is no shortage of good companies doing great things in Charleston. And when they partner with others, they fulfill a symbiotic need.

PAINTING WITH A PURPOSE

Art is a universal salve, both for those creating it and those exposed to it. Colors can be soothing or uplifting. Textures can be surprisingly fascinating, even positively transfixing. And, of course, images can transport the imagination and provide a distraction from discomfort. So it's no wonder art in healing spaces dates back as far as medieval times, when hospitals often doubled as repositories for some of the era's most beloved and notable artwork.

This is a notion embraced by one of our recent social impact partners, The Foundation for Hospital Art, and they know just how to harness

the power of artistic expression and observation. Through this event guests gather to create beautiful murals to be installed at various regional health facilities.

This day of impact can be set up as an al fresco reception where participants are able to mingle and dine, then choose among 30 different canvases to which they could lend an artful hand. No experience is needed - just a willingness to contribute a soothing sweep of a brush here, some compassionate color there. Some guests choose to put their touch on every canvas; others focus on those that speak to their spirit. To watch the configuration of tables transform from blank canvases to finished works of art in a matter of hours was remarkable. And to see the finished murals on display two nights later, at the final evening dinner, was truly soul stirring.

Following the event, the The Foundation for Hospital Art will shepherd the murals to their



new homes.

In these photographs pictured from a recent event, "Dragon Flys" and "Bird Feeders" went to Brunswick, Georgia's Coastal Community Health Services, which embraces the community by seeking to meet the healthcare needs of the medically underserved residents and taking pride in helping that community become healthy. "Tropical Fish" and "Sailboat" landed at St. Simons by the Sea, a behavioral health facility for adults and adolescents struggling with mental health issues and addiction. Finally, "Bears" was installed at Pediatric Associates of Brunswick.
